3. What do you want to do more or less of as a friend?

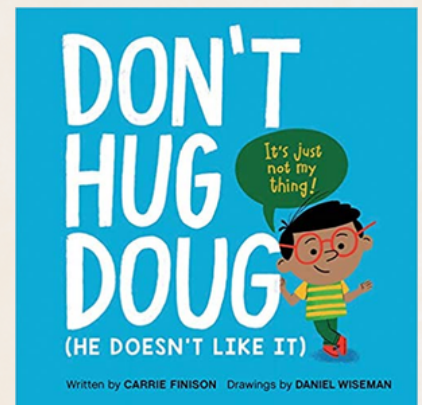
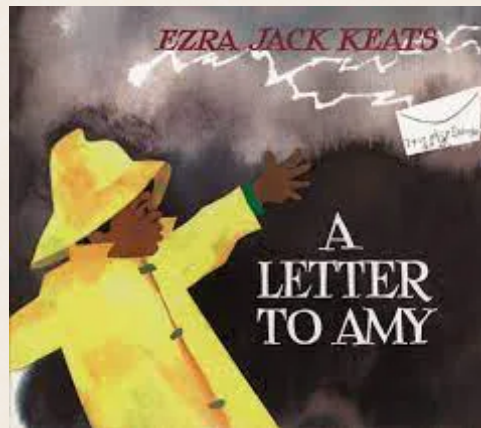
